Saint Joseph High School was founded in 1935, located in the town of Hammond, New Jersey, between Philadelphia and Atlantic City. It is close to the nation's most prestigious Princeton University and near the world-famous Tourist city of Atlantic City, and the nearest airport is the Philadelphia International Airport.



Saint Joseph High School is a Catholic High School accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. The school enrolls 9th to 12th grade students (four years of high school). There are 287 registered students, including six international students. The average class size is of 20 people. Teachers and students ratio is about 1: 15.5. In the fall of 2016, in cooperation between St. Joseph High School and nearby universities, the "University Pathway" program was launched. These cooperative universities will guarantee admission to graduates recommended by St. Joseph High School.

CURRICULUM

The academic program consists of core courses offered on four levels: advanced placement, accelerated, honors, and college preparatory. Among them, AP Courses are offered in Biology, Calculus, Computer Science and English. Students in eleventh and twelfth grades can take elective dual credit courses (high school credits and university credits) and universities-based online courses.

TLBU After School Program

TLBU after-school program includes: English Language Training (ESL) for Asian Students, Intensification of Mathematics Science, Supervising and Guiding students' homework, pre-review next day classes, Communication with American High School Teachers, Tracking and Performance Evaluation of Students in US High School, SAT test counseling (American university entrance examination), personal good character quality training.

TLBU Weekend Field Study Program

Offering special field studies to US major cities(Washington, New York, Philadelphia), international organizations (United Nations Headquarters, World Bank, International Monetary Fund), and prestigious universities (Harvard University, Yale University, MIT, etc.), to help students understand American social culture and the major characteristics and background of famous universities.

TLBU – Home to the students (food & lodging and transportation)

Lodging: A separate area from TLBU's hotel is sectioned for students' dormitory. Every bedroom is equipped with independent bathroom, microwave, mini-fridge, hair dryer, coffee / tea maker, TV, telephone, wardrobe, writing desk, wireless internet. Hotel public area is equipped with indoor tennis courts, gym, outdoor swimming pool, and washer/dryer machine, and Italian/Mexican restaurant. 24-hour available supervising teachers, and front desk clerk.

Food: students' choice of Asian food, and American food.

Transportation: special shuttle takes students to and from the school. Transportation service is also available for students' daily needs.



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
